Welcome back

We hope that everyone had a restful break and are ready for a busy term. It has been wonderful to return to school hearing about how our students spent their school holidays and watching them catch up with friends who they haven't seen for a while.

There are many happenings during the term, so please read over the term 2 calendar of events.

NAPLAN

In week 2 our Years 3, 5 and 7 students are sitting the National Literacy and Numeracy tests. NAPLAN testing is a snapshot of a student's achievement and supports the multiple assessment and diagnostic tools which we use to ascertain how a child is going academically. NAPLAN is an assessment which can be a stressful time for some children. You can help your child by talking positively about the day, continuing with the normal and regular homework programs and making sure they have consistent routines such as early nights to bed and a healthy breakfast.

School Uniform (winter months)

With cooler weather upon us it is important to ensure that our children wear appropriate school uniform to help with regulating their body temperature. Living in the South East can mean that we see some pretty cold and rough weather from time to time. We support and understand that waterproof and thicker than usual jackets (above and beyond the normal school jumper) which may not comply with the school uniform code may be worn whilst in transition to school, however, once student learning begins, students will be asked to remove these articles of clothing. Our schools Governing Council strongly support Newbery Park Primary School's school uniform policy.

Our winter uniform comprises of the following items.

- Navy Blue School Jumper
- Navy Blue Track Suit pants
- School polo top (can be purchased from the front office)
- Blue Check Girls School dress

Items of clothing which are black in colour, leggings, jeans or items with visible stripes or large logos are not items of school uniform.

NET SET GO AT MC LAUGHLIN PARK COURTS

The Millicent Netball Club are once again hosting the Net Set Go program in 2018. We are fortunate to have Helen Hamilton taking on the coordinator role and she is looking forward to working with parents to offer these sessions.

Suncorp NetSetGO is a fun, safe, social and active program for girls and boys aged 5 to 10. It gives kids of all abilities a positive introduction to netball and teaches them the basic skills of the sport.

Suncorp NetSetGO is divided into three tiers, Net, Set and GO, meaning that your child will learn at a pace that's right for their age and ability.

Each week your child will take part in skill based activities, minor games and modified matches that will help them develop fundamental movement skills, as well as important social skills like team work.

This year the sessions will take place at the McLauhlin Park courts on Tuesday nights from 3.45-4.45pm (Term 2 – Weeks 2-10)

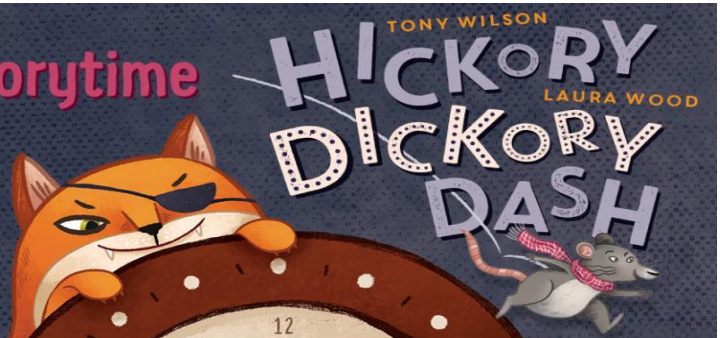
